Committee: Growing Leaders - Scholarship

Activity Description:

It is important to celebrate the achievements of our members. On May 6th, 2024, the chapter hosted our annual awards banquet at the District Service Center to reward members with degrees, awards, and senior scholarships. Chapter FFA members, their families, advisors, and school district leadership are invited to attend.

Goal #1

By May 6th, 2024 twenty percent of the chapter's FFA membership will have received one of the following: degree, letter award, proficiency award, outstanding grade level award, or college or trade school scholarship.

Plan of Action #1

What: Encourage students to earn FFA awards.

Where: Award applications will be posted on the calendar, and social media (SM).

How: The reporter will post award information on SM and calendar, advisors will make class announcements.

Steps: Review goals at committee meetings, create flyers, request SM posts, email advisors with announcements.

Who: The committee, reporter, and advisors will work together to encourage members to apply for awards.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #1

The goal for 20% of our membership to receive an award was exceeded. This year we awarded 193 awards and scholarships to 49 FFA members. The percentage of members that earned awards was 27%.

Goal #2

By May 6th, the chapter officers will award six adult supporters with an honorary Meridian FFA Honorary Degree.

Plan of Action #2

What: Nominate six chapter supporters for the Honorary Degree

Where: Committee and officer meetings are held at the CTC, and awards are given at the District Service Center.

How: Ask members to submit names of adult chapter supporters.

Steps: Request nomination recommendations, select recipients, request nominations to become confirmed at an officer meeting, and present the degrees.

Who: The committee, members, advisors, and recipients.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #2

The committee's goal to present six Honorary degrees was exceeded. This honor was given to eight people including alumni members, administrators, and community partners.

Goal #3

By May 6, 2025 a new officer team will be selected, announced, and installed.

Plan of Action #3

What: A strong officer team is important to a chapter's success. To select a new team, senior officers will create a sifting process.

Where: An application will be posted on the chapter's website. The sifting process will take place at the Career Technical Center.

How: To recruit, the positions will be promoted to chapter members.

Steps: Create an application process, create announcements, host sifting.

Who: Officers, members, and advisors.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #3

Officer sifting was held on 4/17/24. Seven constitutional officers, an alumni rep., three historians were selected. The team was announced at the April meeting. 5/6 the officers were installed.

Advancing Leaders

Due to huge Alumni support and local partnerships, the Meridian FFA Chapter can annually provide \$15,000+ in scholarships to senior members. During the annual Chapter Banquet senior members are highlighted for achievements and presented their scholarship. These awarded scholarships are typically used towards post-secondary education or additional training post high school.

Impact

The Chapter Banquet has a significant impact on the Meridian FFA Chapter members who all receive awards and scholarships throughout the night. This has an impact on members as they are recognized for their hard work and achievements through their FFA career. It also gives members a generous amount of money to help with their education decisions after high school, being awarded scholarships up to \$1,700.

Achievements take place at this event for all FFA members. 13 seniors received scholarships to advance their educations. The banquet our members and promotes lifelong learning and personal development.

Activity Description:

Our annual Fair Booth fundraiser provides to the community at Western Idaho Fair (WIF) by selling beverages and Snow-cones at reasonable prices. The money raised from this event will help offset travel expenses to attend FFA events such as Washington Leadership Conference and Nationals.

Goal #1

Increase net earnings for the fair-booth fundraiser by 10% 2023 by August 25, 2024 (fair over).

Plan of Action #1

- 1.) Get sponsored from amalgamated sugar and possibly other companies to save on sugar. syrups used in our snow cones.
- 2.) Find alternatives to Coca-Cola cups in order to save money.
- 3.) Increase menu diversity to increase market audience.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #1

Yes, we were able to achieve this goal. We increased our net earnings by 10.2%.

Goal #2

Identify the 5 most popular snow cone flavors in order to add sugar free options by the start of the Western Idaho Fair.

Plan of Action #2

- 1.) Research which 5 snow cone flavors have the most demand
- 2.) Identify cheapest options of sugar free syrup
- 3.) Adjust the menu to include the added flavors

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #2

We did not completely meet this goal. We collected data on the 5 most important flavors but did not implement them with sugar-free syrup. We will add sugar-free flavors next year.

Goal #3

Develop a system to track consumer's orders for correctness for 2024 Western Idaho Fair. Our goal is to reach 90% perfectly fulfilled orders.

Plan of Action #3

1.) Determine a way to produce receipts/tickets in order to maintain organization in the booth.

2.) Track which orders we handed out incorrectly and correctly to calculate customer satisfaction.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #3

This goal was met. We were able to track correctness for orders, but we did not collect substantial data and were unable to come to a conclusion.

Advancing Community

Provides a community driven economic development for the Meridian FFA chapter through purchasing food items from a local school driven organization with the intention of creating leadership for the community's future. It teaches these students the basics of business and customer service while providing goods to fair goers.

Impact

This has a major impact on the Meridian FFA chapter as it is one of our main sources of income. The fair booth teaches kids about work ethic and time management as they are expected to show up to their shift as if it was their job. It provides funding for kids to go on trips and gain experiences outside of the classroom.

Related to Quality Standard

The quality standard for this event is Economic Development. The Western Idaho Fair Booth gives students an opportunity to learn what it takes to run a business while raising money for their chapter at the same time and making the community happy.

Accomplishments

We had significantly more shifts filled before fair began. We also rearranged the storge of some items to maximize the efficiency of the layout and make it easier to move around and work in a rush.

The chapter gained new members, leadership opportunities, and positive feedback from students, teachers, and district leadership.

Related to Quality Standard

The Meridian FFA Ag expo has FFA members create 2-3 minute speeches about livestock, natural resource, animal production etc. Over the course of three days these speeches were presented multiple times to 200 community members and 2,900 first graders.

Accomplishments

We taught 2,900 first graders and 200 adult community members about the importance of agriculture, food, and natural resources.

Recommendations

For next year I recommend that we let the bus drivers and teachers know the plan for executing the drop off and pick up plan for the first graders so that it can be as safe as possible. We also recommend bringing the winner of the first grade coloring contest to one of our meetings in the following month so that we can recognize them and give them an award.

The goal was met. Officers created three workshopsareas of activities for students, including the ice-breaker activity, a room for committees, and a room for students to learn about CDEs/LDEs.

Goal #3

By 9/25 the officers, committy, and advisors will encourage 600 potential members by Remind, flyers, and homeroom visits by talking about FFA activities and personal experiences.

The Alumni Auction is an outreach event where members volunteer to help our Alumni and Supporters as they raise funds, which help the Meridian FFA chapter's activities and senior scholarships. Working with our support group fosters relationships with mentors and provides interaction with community members as they model what it means to give back.

Goal #1

The chapter exceeded this goal. Our net income was 24% more than last year, surpassing all our expectations. We netted \$25,000 in 2023 and \$31,000 in 2024.

Plan of Action #2

To accomplish this goal, the committee will reach out to teachers and students to organize student projects to be donated.

An advisor will work with the committee to post a sign-up form.

The committee chairs will follow up with volunteers one week before the deadline.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #2

The goal was not met. We had four projects total, two from our horticulture program and two from our welding program. Next year, the reporter will post more requests for donations on social media.

Goal #3

By October 11th, the committee and alumni will collect and inventory all donated items, including an officer and chapter basket, which will kept in the CTC storage building.

Plan of Action #3

The committee will get the approval to store items in the storage shed from an advisor.

The collection site will be communicated to potential donors and the CTC secretary.

The alumni representative will reach out to donors and the Alumni with the storage location and deadline.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #3

This goal was met. The officer basket was a huge success, and all items were collected before October 11th and safely stored by the deadline.

Accomplishments

We had over 40 volunteers, many younger members volunteer and assist with auction activities. Our chapter members helped with spotting, and everyone branched out of their comfort zones.

Recommendations

Please start officer basket activities at the beginning of September, making sure to get the word out so officers can attain the required materials. Coordinate with volunteers by text; no one checks email.

Creating a Sign-Up Genius and organizing volunteers through people who signed up may be easier, but the Alumni are particular about the types of students handling their money. This past year, we spoke with each member and planned through that, creating a spreadsheet of members who would fit best.

Also, coordinating with advisors on who is spotting is a great thing to plan ahead of time.

Activity Description:

The Goal of our Produce Sale is to provide quality produce for those in our community, donate to the families in our district that are in need, and fundraise money to send our members on trips to enhance each members ability to engage in agricultural opportunities that will fuel future career fields.

Goal #1

To increase the net profit by 10% for Produce Sales from previous year.

Plan of Action #1

After the success we saw with the incentive we created last year, we will do that again. There will be cash prizes for first, second, third, fourth, and fifth place ranging from \$150- \$50.in addition to that, for every \$200 worth of produce sold will be one entry into a raffle for a \$200 D&B gift card.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #1

Our net profit this year was only \$8000, Due to low member involvement, the goal was unmet. Next year, we need to promote sales through social media videos to encourage members to participate.

Goal #2

Have 90% of Produce Sales shifts signed up and filled by members prior to November 27, 2024.

Plan of Action #2

We will announce and advertise the Produce Sale at the November chapter meeting as well as on the chapter's Instagram and Facebook pages. Additionally, we will run the same incentive contest as last year. All these things will help to make students aware of Produce Sale shifts and push them to sign up and help out.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #2

This goal was unmet due to low member involvement. Going forward, the committee will communicate the importance of fundraising to members and personally invite them to help.

Goal #3

The produce sale committee chairs need to hold a minimum of two meetings to be successful between the time of the November meeting and at the Christmas meeting to finish the tasks that will need completed for produce sale.

Plan of Action #3

Holding these committee meetings will allow us to work through issues in the produce or with the members and gain knowledge of the inventory and the amount being sold. Along with gaining a committee and informing our members about the meeting and keeping in contact with them for better success in sales.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #3

We exceeded our goal. The Committee chairs met with their committee three times between November 1st and January 14th to plan this activity.

Advancing Community

Meridian FFA chapter members and advisors recognized that there were people in our community with food insecurities and decided to help. Because of this, the December chapter meeting is dedicated to serving others. During this meeting, members packaged produce donation boxes and made cards for military members who were deployed overseas. We believe that our efforts have provided fresh food for those who may not have access to it regularly and brightened the spirits of our military.

Impact

Chapter members worked together to package 150 boxes of fresh produce and create 33 cards for military members overseas. The gift boxes were donated to the families in need within our school district. The cards were delivered to military men and women via a mail program through the local military base. Our service not only benefited those receiving the cards and gift boxes, but it also allowed our chapter members to look for needs around us and be the people to fill others' needs.

Related to Quality Standard

By taking the money that was donated by community members and using it to donate gift boxes we gave away over \$4000 worth of produce rather than keeping all that additional money for the chapter that went back into the communities and families.

Accomplishments

Because we had an incentive for our salesman this year, we sold almost three times as much produce as we did last year. We had 40 salesman this year compared to the 28 salesmen we had last year.

Recommendations

The most beneficial thing that we did in terms of raising the number of sales this year was creating an incentive for salesmen.

Appreciation Breakfast for the Meridian Community

Activity Description:

The community appreciation breakfast is a student led event that is free of charge to the community. This breakfast is held by the meridian FFA chapter at the meridian career technical center. This breakfast is designed to feed numerous community members that help support our FFA chapter.

Goal #1

By 8:00 am on 2/21, the chapter will have increased 5% community member attendance to the FFA appreciation breakfast.

Plan of Action #1

To increase community attendance, the committee will do the following:

Six weeks before the breakfast, we will review and update the invitation mailing list, and a total of 500 invitations will be printed and addressed. One month before the breakfast, invitations will be mailed. At two weeks and one week before the event, reminders will be posted on our social media.

5). We will send out a minimum of 500 invitations.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #1

The goal was not met. We had 259 community members attend the breakfast. This was a decrease of 103 guests. Next year, we need to invite guests by community event calendars to increase involvement.

Goal #2

By 2/14, 90% of the volunteer slots for the appreciation breakfast will be filled by FFA members.

Plan of Action #2

To accomplish this goal, the committee will do the following:

Six weeks before the breakfast a committee member will make a Sign Up Genius and post it to the chapter calendar.

Once posted, the committee will work with the Reporter to post weekly reminders to sign up. Lastly, a QR code linked to the signup will be displayed and promoted at the January chapter meeting.

3Bring up breakfast signup at the January officer meeting.

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #2

We exceeded the goal. We were able to get 100% of volunteer slots filled one week prior to the breakfast.

Goal #3

By 12/7/2024, we will have found four community sponsors to donate enough money to cover the cost of the food for the appreciation breakfast.

Plan of Action #3

To help meet our goal, the following will be completed.

By December 1st, we will have a list of 10 possible sponsors. By January 1st, we will need to confirm support from a minimum of 4 sponsors. Lastly, all donations will be received and food items purchased. The week before the breakfast, the chairman will confirm that donated funds have been received and the needed food items have been purchased

Outcome Evaluated and Reported #3

Our chapter exceeded this goal. We were able to get all food donated as well as at least 6 sponsors prior to the breakfast and all food items were purchased a week before the event.

Advancing Community

Showing gratitude is a leadership trait every FFA member should develop. We hosted a free breakfast during FFA week to show our appreciation to those who support our chapter. This event was attended by alumni, teachers, district leaders, industry partners, government officials, and a morning TV crew. Members were able to promote FFA and talk with community members to express gratitude for their support.

Impact

The appreciation breakfast left a meaningful impression on our FFA members, advisors, community, and supporters. Showing appreciation is a valuable life skill. 55 members and 13 advisors were able to thank our supporters by serving 259 people a free breakfast. A TV crew broadcast live and interviewed 2 students and an advisor. As a result, viewers across the Treasure Valley learned about our chapter and the positive impact FFA has on young people.
